Publicity is 'cheapest way for recruitment'

The American Legion October 11, 2021

Daniel R. Olsen Eagan American Legion Post 594 in Eagan, Minn., was about to close its doors in 2016 due to a decline in membership and active participation. But together, past Post 594 Commander John Flynn and current Commander Wayne Beierman helped save the post by turning around membership – from 77 members to now 410.

"It's about active recruiting, being relevant in the community and letting people know (that we are relevant) by publicizing what we do," Beierman said. "Every community can't do what we have done, but every community can do the publicity. If you do something put it in the paper so people can see it. No matter how big or small it is, if you can get it in the paper with a headline, it helps with recruiting."

Post 594 does not have a post home; members meet in a banquet room at a local bowling alley. But they publicize in the local newspaper all that they do for their community. Examples include:

- Holding two flag retirement ceremonies a year with Boy Scouts.
- Reading the book "F is for Flag" to first graders and donating copies of the book to classrooms.
- Donating flags to the City of Eagan.
- Recognizing veterans on their birthdays and for their military service.
- Conducting a 9/11 ceremony.
- Recognizing graduating high school seniors who sign up for the military.
- Paying membership dues for veterans at a veterans home in Hastings, along with hosting cookouts there, decorating for the holidays and playing games with the veterans.
- Hosting a blood drive the Friday before Memorial Day where the post achieves about 150 percent of its goal.

- Feeding breakfast to families once a month at a nearby Fisher House.
- Providing certificates of appreciation to local businesses and community leaders such as first responders and teachers.
- Providing an unserviceable flag drop off box to Sam's Club.

"If you use the four pillars as your reason for being in the community, it's easy to talk about The American Legion," Beierman said. "We get our name out there in the newspaper – the cheapest way for recruitment. People see us in the paper and know we're relevant in the community. It's also helped us in fundraising because they see what they do.

"We publicize virtually everything we do."

Nebraska SAL donates to Medal of Honor Highway project

The SAL Detachment of Nebraska presented a \$4,000 check to Tom Hansen of the Nebraska Medal of Honor Foundation on Oct. 10 in Omaha, to help fund signs along the Nebraska Medal of Honor Highway. Photo provided.

A donation from the SAL Detachment of Nebraska will help place two signs along the Nebraska Medal of Honor Highway.

Detachment Commander Chris Casey and others presented a \$4,000 check to Tom Hansen, treasurer of the Nebraska Medal of Honor Foundation, at an event in Omaha, Neb., on Oct. 10.

Tom Hansen is the great-nephew of Medal of Honor recipient Dale Hansen. A native of Wisner, Neb., Dale Hansen earned the Medal of Honor for his actions against Japanese troops on Okinawa on May 7, 1945, dying four days later.

On Jan. 31, 2020, Nebraska Gov. Pete Ricketts signed paperwork renaming the 432-mile stretch of U.S. Highway 20 running through his state the "Nebraska Medal of Honor Highway." The renaming is the continuation of an effort that began in Oregon in 2018 and has since moved into Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming. Similar efforts have begun in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, and Massachusetts, with the hope the designation eventually extends all the way to the end of Highway 20 in Boston.

"For us Sons that may not have served, I mean it's everything for us to be able to give back to our communities so to know we're part of something bigger than ourselves, it's huge, it's a huge feeling, a big sense of accomplishment and honor to do things," Casey told WOWT-TV.

Sons of The American Legion Veterans Employment and Education Commission SOP for Detachments

The creation of a Veterans Employment and Education Committee (or Sub-committee) within a Detachment can greatly benefit the Sons of The American Legion. While VE&E and VA&R are closely tied and often associated together, they cover completely different issues America's veterans are facing.

Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Program Outline I. Volunteer Services II. Support Military Troops A. USO B. Squadron/Individual Support (Phone cards, Care Packages) C. POW/MIA Issues D. AL Operation Comfort Warrior E. My Healthy Vet III. Collaborative Program Efforts A. National Veterans Assistance Day B. Fisher House C. Veterans Suicide Prevention as well as other programs.

Veterans Employment and Education deals with programs involving veteran's education, small business, employment, veteran's preference, VA home loans, homeless veterans, training, licensing and certification, transition, USERRA, and other issues related to economics.

As you can see, there is too much ground to cover by only one committee/commission.

<u>Suggested</u> responsibilities for a Detachment VE&E Committee would include (not limited to):

- Coordinate with the national VE&E Commission (attend meetings and conference calls),
- Coordinate with your respective Department VE&E Commission to assist in job/career fairs, homeless stand-downs, or other events,
- Disseminate the information provided by the VE&E Commissions on the state and national level to the District/County and Squadron levels.
- Identify the active community-based Veteran Service Providers in your areas and understand what their needs are.

- Educate yourselves and your members on veteran homelessness so you may educate others,
- Promote local businesses that hire veterans,
- Hold a fundraiser/make a donation to a veteran's outreach program,
- Contact local officials to see what is being done to end veteran homelessness-become an advocate.
- In short, there are numerous ways that your Detachment can advocate for, assist, and promote Veterans Employment and Education.



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Buddy Checks for Veterans Day

Buddy Checks are particularly timely since Veterans Day is next It's a perfect month. time to conduct Buddy Checks on post members and veterans in the community so I am encouraging departments and posts to make calls

during the week of Nov. 11.

American Legion Family members are making Buddy Check calls on regular schedules to let veterans and their families know they are not alone and that the American Legion Family stands ready to assist them in any way it can. If a Legionnaire calls you for a Buddy Check, don't take that as an implication that you are struggling. Buddy Checks are for all veterans, but suicide prevention is perhaps the greatest benefit that can come from a Buddy Check.

Last month, in its annual report on National Veteran Suicide Prevention. VA updated its data to show a 7.2 percent decrease in veteran suicide in 2019 from the year before. The figure used is that 17.2 veterans per day took their own lives in 2019. The American Legion will not be satisfied until that figure is ZERO.

More recently, however, USA Today reported a 15 percent increase of suicide among active-duty troops in 2020.

We have a lot of work to do. And by "we" I don't mean just The American Legion but America as a whole. Buddy Checks are only one tool. We must remove all stigmas associated with asking for help or being diagnosed with PTSD, depression or any other condition that could lead one to take his or her own life.

We must reach out to our Afghanistan veterans who are experiencing a whole range of emotions due to recent events. We need to ensure that they are not isolated and that they know that they have a home and friends in our American Legion Family.

If you need help with starting a Buddy Check team, making phone calls, or knowing what to say, a toolkit with this information and other valuable resources is available at www.legion.or/buddycheck.

Whether it's through Buddy Checks or any of our programs for veterans and their families, we prove time and again that we are Veterans Strengthening America who believe in No Veteran Left Behind.





This is a close-knit family, all with hearts of gold, and Thomas M. Brady Post 45 is happy to have Ken and Silas back as members, and hope the others transfer back to their first home post as well.



With little notice to servicemembers, the Department of Defense (DOD) terminated the Troops to Teachers program (TTT) this October – and we need your help in calling on Congress to reauthorize the program. Take action by contacting your Congressman through our Legislative Action Center.

Established in 1993, Troops to Teachers was designed to assist transitioning servicemembers and veterans to begin careers as educators in K-12 public, charter, and Bureau of Indian Affairs schools. The Department of Defense reported that the program placed over 21,000 veteran teachers in classrooms since its inception. Additionally, the program provides counseling and referral services to help participants meet education and licensing requirements, as well as helps them secure a teaching position. Since 1993, more than 100,000 veterans have successfully transitioned to a career in education.

In the wake of record teacher shortages across the country, the value of Troops to Teachers cannot be understated. It provides employment assistance to transitioning veterans, which aids in lowering veteran unemployment; it alleviates nationwide teaching shortages, which improves education quality; and it increases access and representation among traditionally less-represented groups to teaching careers. DOD reported that the program placed over 21,000 veteran teachers in classrooms since its inception.

Now is not the time to cut transition pathways for <u>our servicemembers</u>. Studies have proven that veteran educators fill thousands of vacancies in highneeds schools and subject areas; are more likely to not relocate after they are employed as teachers; are considered effective instructors; have high job and life satisfaction; and even have a positive effect on increasing student likelihood to serve.

Senate Section 573 in the FY 2022 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) would reauthorize the Troops-To-Teachers program and produce an assessment illustrating the cost and benefits of the program to members of the armed forces, veterans, and local educational agencies.

The American Legion proudly supports this amendment and asks that you contact your Repre-

sentatives and tell them to keep Senate Section 573 in the FY 2022 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).

Unfortunately, at this time, if we do not receive these specific forms the database will not show the post/squadron as being active and membership processing cannot be done until the data is uploaded in the system.

REMINDER: This Post Data Report & Squadron Data Report attached *only* applies to new posts / squadrons. You will continue to send in your annual Post / Squadron data reports annually by your previous methods of submission.

Our sincerest of apologies for this untimely delay throughout this new system migration charter process and appreciate everyone's patience and understanding as we transition to this new way of processing charter requests moving forward.


