Jeff Vrabel, Sr. is the proud son of United States Army and Korean War Veteran, Past Department of Ohio Commander the late Joseph K. Vrabel (2003-2004).

Jeff strives to live a “Service to Others” philosophy instilled in him by his parents, Joe and Nadene. With the support of his family and friends, he has demonstrated a commitment to his Community, State, and Nation in various ways. He was the Commander of the nearly 30,000 member Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Ohio for the 2005-2006 membership year and has served as commander of Mahoning Valley Squadron 15 in Poland, Ohio where he is a founding, charter, and life member. In 2002, he was named the Earl A. Cox Outstanding Member of the Year by the Detachment of Ohio. He is also a three-time Past Commander of the Dynamic Ninth District.

Jeff works with various Veterans Service Organizations throughout Mahoning County and in 2011 was named Citizen of the Year for service to Veterans and Americanism by the United Veterans’ Council of Greater Youngstown. Since 2010, he has served as Chairman of the Memorial Day Processional Parade and Memorial Ceremonies in his hometown of Poland, Ohio.

He was member of the Poland Community Baseball Association, Inc. for over 25-years, serving in various capacities including player, Manager, Coach, Umpire, Publicity Director, member of the Board of Trustees, Umpire-in-Chief, and Assistant Tournament Director for various tournaments, including two Little League Baseball® Ohio State Tournaments. He was also a member of the Tri-T Baseball/Softball League where he served as Secretary, Vice-President, member of the Board of Directors, Umpire-in-Chief, and Publicity Director. Mr. Vrabel serves as a Field Director and West Region, East Zone Baseball Umpire-In-Chief for PONY Baseball/Softball, Inc. of Washington, Pennsylva-

nia, and has umpired eleven Dick’s Sporting Goods Pony League World Series and one Colt Baseball World Series, including six assignments as Home Plate Umpire in Pony Baseball International Championship games. He is a member of the Grove City Ohio Little League Advisory Board and is an Ohio District 6 Little League Assistant District Administrator, serving as District Safety Officer. In August 2021, Jeff was an umpire at the Little League® Baseball Central Region Tournament in Whitestown, Indiana, as well as receiving another assignment to the Dick’s Sporting Goods Pony League World Series.

He referees NCAA football in the North Coast Athletic Conference and is a former official in the Presidents Athletic Conference and the Mountain East Conference with the Tri-State Intercollegiate Football Officials Association, and the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He also referees basketball and football for the Ohio High School Athletic Association and has volunteered with Mahoning County Special Olympics. He was secretary of the Bulldog Turf Club, an organization that raised nearly one-million dollars to install a synthetic playing surface at Poland Seminary High School’s Dave Pavlansky Field.

Jeff and his wife Mary (Unit 15) have three sons: Jeff, Jr., Kenneth, and Phillip, all members of Mahoning Valley Squadron 15. His mother, Nadene, and his sister, Melissa, are also members of Mahoning Valley Unit 15.

Jeff is a graduate of Poland Seminary High School in Poland, Ohio, as well as from the Millwork/Carpentry program at the Mahoning County Joint Vocational School in Canfield, Ohio. He attended Youngstown State University and as an Honor Student at Walsh University.

For over twenty-seven years, Jeff has worked in the pupil transportation industry in both the public and private sectors. He is a two-time Past President of the Ohio Association for Pupil Transportation, (OAPT) Past Chair of the State and National Associations Council of the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services where he served on the Board of Directors. He is also a former member of the Board of Directors of the Ohio Association for School Business Officials (OASBO).

In 2012, he was named the Outstanding Transportation Director of the Year by the Ohio Association for School Business Officials Foundation for School Business Management. In 2013, the Ohio Associa-

tion for Pupil Transportation named him the William Rice Award of Excellence for Pupil Transportation Supervisor of the Year.

He is the owner of Zebra Transportation and provides professional development to pupil transportation professionals across the country. Presentations are also provided to other professionals in various industries. He also owns Just Married Wedding Services where his has been an Ohio wedding officiant since 2002, and assists at funerals as requested.

He is employed by the Franklin County (OH) Clerk of Courts.

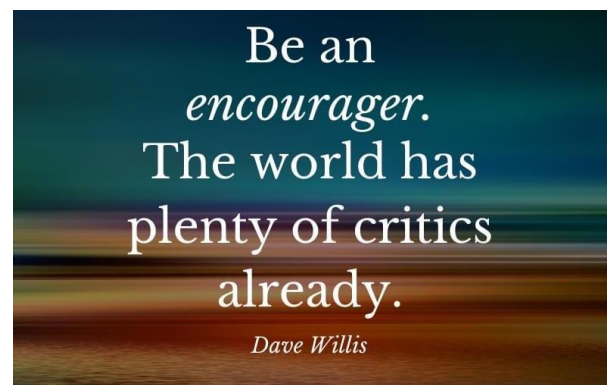
