Chairman James Naylor reported that we need to collect pop tabs at our Posts and Districts.

Americanism & Government

Chairman Larry Cripe stated that the time has passed to pick up the 4th grade Flag Education Test. You can still order tests and pick them up at Department Headquarters by October 13, 2017. All tests must be returned by December 22, 2017. On Veterans Day, November 11, assist your Post with any ceremonies.

Children & Youth Commission

Chairman Martin reported that he was able to attend the National Children & Youth Conference last September and shared the following:

Only 1,780 Squadrons or 29% returned their Consolidated Report Forms. Just think what our numbers could be if everyone took the time to report what their Squadrons and members do each year.

PDC Brown made a motion to accept the Children & Youth Commission report, 2nd by PDC Pfeiffer.

Motion passed.

Internal Affairs Commission, Chairman Randy Blake

Campout

Campout Committeeman Jay Huffman reported that the Campout bid information is in and bids must be returned by January 1, 2018. There is an invitation letter included with the bid information, and the Committee accepted both forms. There needs to be a flyer put out, "American Legion Family Campout" sponsored by the Detachment of Indiana. Campout will be on June 22-23, 2018.

Religious Emphasis

Chairman Jerad Long reported the need to distribute and promote the Sons Manual of Ceremony & Prayers. Points of emphasis:

- Encourage developing a relationship with local Community in Outreach
- More connection with The American Legion Religious Emphasis Committee to improve both Committees
- Strengthening the core of our membership by acknowledging our faith

We were informed that Ceremony Manuals were passed out with the membership packets; you will need to get with someone at your Post. Alternatively, we will have some at the next meeting or they can be requested by calling Department.

Community Involvement

Chairman Parry Schlimmer stated that we need to help Veterans Organizations. Replace worn Flags with new ones and get information from Squadrons on upcoming events. Get your information out as quickly as you can and on the website; two months is two late.

Scholarship

Chairman Charles Gemlich stated that it is not too early to push this program. When you attend Legion and Sons District meetings, remind the members that this program exists and the scholarship is for \$1,000. Applications will be available in the spring.

Information & Training

Committeeman Terry Slagle stated that the Committee needs videos from the Committee and Commissions to share in training sessions. The Committee also needs Squadrons or Districts to host training sessions.

Legislative

The Indiana Legion website for Call to Action is www.indianalegion.org/legislative .

House Enrolled Act 1001--the budget bill providing funding for:

- (a) Veterans Treatment Courts, funding \$1 million each year for the establishment, training and certification of Veterans problem-solving courts
- (b) Hyperbaric oxygen therapy grants to assist Veterans in receiving this pilot or research treatment for traumatic brain injury
- (c) Homeless Veterans grants to assist Veterans struggling with homelessness and related issues
- (d) State Service Officer funding of \$300,000 each year for 6 additional State Service Officers.
- (e) Veteran Service Organization funding increase-\$910,000 for Veteran Service Organizations providing Veterans benefits services
- (f) Increase in military retiree deduction from \$5000 to \$6,250

Overall, our advocates helped secure six of the original twelve legislative priorities of the Indiana Legion this session.

The Big Four met with Appropriations Committee Chairman regarding programs and funding. Gov. Eric Holcomb himself came to the Big Four to ask for their backing and support of his tax exemption priority for military retirees.

According to Department Adjutant William Henry, “It is important to note that The American Legion, Department of Indiana, did not accomplish these endeavors alone.” This was an organized and concerted effort from all Veteran and Military Organizations and Associations in this State.

Department would like more of our members to become advocates on Veterans issues by using your voice and sending letters to our state legislature. The new, user-friendly advocacy software has been introduced to the Department website at www.indianalegion.org/legislative. This new tool allows our members to become advocates on Veterans issues, simply by entering their information. A list of your elected officials in your area is generated, and pre-drafted letters supporting issues concerning Veterans can be sent at the click of a button.

Convention

Chairman Mike Arend assisted Commander Long in passing out the winning plaques to the Commission winners from the 2017 Convention. Chairman Arend also stated that he needs to talk to the adjutant about the entertainment for the 2018 Convention.

Public Relations and Information Technology

Chairman Doug Heiser stated information needs to be sent to him so we can resume the Detachment Newsletter. Send your articles and pictures to dough@metalink.net starting now. Make sure if your Squadron is holding an event that someone contacts the local media so they can cover it if they so choose. Put your events in the “what’s happening” section of your community newspaper. Most papers will run this for a week or two and it’s free. Follow up with a Thank You in the editorial section, thanking everyone who helped with donations and those who supported the event. This will bring more public awareness to our organization. If your Squadron doesn’t have a Face Book page, establish one. Social media is where young and old alike are seeing what is happening around them, and again it’s free. The new Sons Parade Banner was unveiled.

A motion to accept the Internal Affairs Commission report was made by FO Spaulding, 2nd by 6th DC Byers. Motion passed.

Rehabilitation Commission, David Mummert, Chairman

Indiana Veteran’s Home

Chairman James Arter stated that the Committee discussed the September Bingo which had 20 Legion Family Members help about 65 residents play about 75 Bingo games. Again everyone had a great time and all the prizes were won. The next Bingo will be on December 16 with set-up at 12:30 to 1:00 p.m. and Bingo from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m.

The Committee had a discussion about the needs of the residents. It was brought up at the September Bingo about needing socks and disposable underwear. Chairman Arter talked with Joe Hedrick about needed sizes, L, XL, and XXL for both women and men. A motion was made by Jeff Coulter to donate \$1,000 towards this need, 2nd by Greg Wagner. Motion carried.

V.A. V.S.

Rehabilitation Chairman David Mummert reported that the Louisville VAMC still needs a Sons Representative. Each District needs to reach out to your local VAMC and find out their wish list and any needs. Chairman Mummert called on PDC David Stephens for any other thoughts on the subject. PDC Stephens said that being a Representative is not a 40-hour-a-week job. It is one of being in contact with Voluntary Services and finding their needs and seeing if you can find someone to fill them. It could be an hour here and there just sitting and talking. Also, you do not have to be the Representative in order to volunteer at your local VAMC.

Homeless Veterans

Committeeman Chip Conrad stated that we could start collecting hotel shampoo and soap and turn it in to your District's Homeless Fund. Check with your District and see if they are doing any Homeless Veterans Programs. You can donate used furniture or bedding to a homeless shelter.

Rehabilitation Commission

Chairman Mummert reported that the Department of Indiana has partnered up with My Computer Career to find solutions for Veterans affected by the ITT-Tech closures. With campuses in Indiana, Ohio, North Carolina and Texas, My Computer Career is partnering with Operation Job Ready Vets, a new outreach program that offers financial support and education opportunities to Indiana Military Veterans. One of their next classes is the IT Systems Administration course starting at the Indiana campuses on Friday, October 21. Tuesday, October 18, is the next start date for the online version. Another class will start approximately six weeks later. For more information you can contact Department Asst. Adjutant John Crosby at 317-630-1264 or at jcrosby@indianalegion.org. The Department of Indiana is committed to providing continued service to fellow Veterans, their families and Communities because "We Change Lives."

10th DC Mummert made a motion to accept the Rehabilitation Commission report, 2nd by PDC Paulus. Motion passed.

Commander Long called on the stand-alone Committees.

Sons In Need

Committeeman Ron Sexton reported that they discussed putting the program on the website to get more participation. The Committee is still seeking a minimum donation of \$10.00 from each Squadron to help build the fund. The Committee is also taking another look at the requirements and will present them at the Mid-Winter Conference. PDC Sexton made a motion to accept the Sons In Need Committee report, 2nd by JA Pfeiffer. Motion passed.

V. E. & E.

Chairman Dennis Budd reported that Blair Milo, the ex-Mayor of LaPorte has a new Cabinet position on Employment and Education of people for the 1,000,000 jobs that will be in Indiana next year. You can go to IN.gov to find her site, which includes lots of information for Veterans and on job fairs.

ANEC Keith Williams says he will get the V.E. & E. pamphlets as soon as he can find who prints them. The Committee will distribute the pamphlets in their travels. Chairman Budd is also in contact with Dwayne Arndt of Senator Donnelly's office on Veterans employment issues. 3rd DC Budd moved to accept the V.E. & E. Committee Report, 2nd by PDC Slagle. Motion passed.

Finance & Budget

Chairman Greg Spaulding stated that there were two requests for funds that came before the Finance & Budget Committee:

1. The IVH Committee requested \$1,000 to purchase disposable undergarments for both men and women (Depends-L, XL, XXL). The check should have "Depends" on the memo line. This request was approved.
2. An additional expense for moving the Tank has come in for \$1,867.50 from Doc's Crane and Rigging after donations. The Committee decided that more information is needed as the Detachment has already given out \$1,000 towards a crane. The question is has that been applied towards the bill, or did that money go to Midnight Blue Towing. The Bill to Doc's Crane is for \$2,492.50 and was paid for with check #1282 by the 2nd District Sons. The following gave donations: 11th District, \$125; 8th & 9th Districts, \$250; Squadron 94, \$150; Squadron 502, \$250. A check was written to the Legion Riders from Post 502 for \$150 for food at the Dedication. More information is needed from the 2nd District "Tank Committee." This information needs to go the Adjutant and this Committee at Mid-Winter Conference.

*At 11:45 a.m. this update was delivered. The Detachment has paid "Midnight Blue Towing \$2750". Doc's bill is for setting the Tank at IVH, an additional \$1867.50 currently going back to the 2nd District. PDC Spaulding made a motion to accept the Finance and Budget report, 2nd by PDC D.P. Stephens. During discussion PDC D.P. Stephens ask if the Otis R. Bowen Veteran House (Indy Vet House) could be put on the budget as an annual donation. Chairman Spaulding stated that he remembers that being brought up but there is nothing at this time. Motion passed.
