Commander Martin called on David Stephens to introduce guests.

Past National Commander David Stephens introduced the following guests:
Ken George, SAL National Liaison.

SAL National Liaison Ken George came forward and addressed the meeting. Ken congratulated Indiana on being 100% last year. Ken said the Sons have had 22 straight years of membership increase. Last year was an increase of over 1%. Squadrons can now do online transmittal of membership cards, once your squadron is set up and makes it first transmittal your cards will be on the National rolls within 4 days. Ken said that the eligibility for the Sons still includes stepsons and also all direct male descendants of veterans who are American Legion members or who are deceased and were eligible to be American Legion members. The SAL Preamble to the Constitution has been changed from "Great Wars" to "All Wars". The CSR report is now a fillable PDF form online, your squadron can fill it out and email directly to National. Ken said that the National organization is moving away from paper forms.

Marine PFC Louis Wieseman of Richmond, IN went missing on November 21, 1943 on the island of Betio, part of the Gilbert Islands. He will be buried on April 18, 2020.

US Army Air Force Tech Sgt. Charles G. Ruble of Parker City, IN. His aircraft was shot down on the border of Germany and the Netherlands. He will be buried on March 3, 2020 at Arlington National Cemetery.

Marine Corps Reserve Pvt. William E. Rambo of LaPorte, IN went missing on the island of Betio, part of the Gilbert Islands. He will be buried on April 11, 2020 at Arlington National Cemetery.

Marine Corps PFC Marley R. Artnur Holts of South Bend, IN. He was on the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. He was buried on November 30, 2019 in Granger, IN.

Children's Hospital Committee:

Acting Chairman Brian Hauser reported that the Detachment still has Josh Dogs available to pass out.

Special Olympics Committee:

Chairman Brian Gilbert reported the State Summer games will be held in June in Terre Haute. Winter games will be held in Lawrenceburg at Perfect North Slopes in February. Bowling was just completed last month.

Junior Shooting Sports Committee:

Acting Chairman Mike Shuler reported that Junior Shooting Sports programs are up and running after the Christmas break. Please get information out when you are having matches. The State Match will be March 14, 2020 in Seymour, IN.

Child Welfare Foundation Committee:

Acting Chairman Chris Carlton reported that YTD the Detachment has raised \$2016. Our goal is \$1 per member, 38,898 members. National YTD total is \$103,888.74. The Committee is considering possibly doing a raffle during the Spring Conference DEC. We need to do what we can to raise more money.

Greg Spaulding said that we need to assist with getting students for the Oratorical contests. There is \$414,000.00 in scholarships available.

Southern Vice Commander Jeff Coulter made a motion to accept the Children & Youth Commission report, 2nd PDC James Arter. Motion passed.

Internal Affairs Commission:

Acting Chairman Doug Heiser said all committees had reported and gave the following reports.

Convention Committee:

Chairman Dewey Long came forward and said that the committee is looking at possibly laying 2 wreaths before the start of the Convention, one at the Medal of Honor Memorial and one at the 911 Memorial. We will need to request permission. The committee would like to see if a post with a bus could provide transportation to the wreath laying's. The committee request permission to invite the Governor of Indiana, the National Commander & Leading Candidate for National Commander. The Indiana SAL NEC would contact the press. It will be up to the Detachment whether to lay one wreath or two. The committee will need to request money for the wreath and will have a dollar amount at Spring Conference.

Religious Emphasis Committee:

Acting Chairman Jeff Gresley said that squadrons need to participate in their Post Four Chaplains Ceremony on February 1st. Get out and visit local hospitals & nursing homes. Visit IVH as often as possible. Continue to help with your American Legion Post. Get Involved!

Legislative Committee:

Chairman Mark Franke reported several new laws were promulgated during the past quarter:

- Certain Federal facilities are now required to fly the POW/MIA flag each day.
- Several federal facilities have been named to honor service members.
- The Support Suicide Prevention Act requires Government Accountability Office to survey report on VA services designed to prevent veteran suicide.

Two bills are in the President's desk awaiting his signature as of January 8th:

- A Fallen Soldier Display will be authorized at all national cemeteries.
- A new grant program for cemetery research will be established and educational materials will be made available to the public for cemetery research efforts.

The National Legion continues its focus on implementation of the Blue Water Navy Act, the current controversy over housing conditions on military bases, and confusion on eligibility for GI Bill benefits for National Guardsmen deployed to the southern border.

The Indiana General Assembly has three bills directly related to veterans. One removes the property tax deduction cap for disabled veterans, another provides resident tuition at state universities for non-resident veterans and their families if they enroll within one year after discharge, and the third addresses several administrative issues at the state Department of Veterans Affairs. All are in first reading and assigned to committee.

Current 2020 legislative scorecard for bills submitted that reference veterans:

U.S. Congress-1,181 bills introduced; 176 have passed at least one chamber; 31 have become law. (Note that these bills reference veterans in some manner but are not necessarily limited to veterans)

Indiana General Assembly-3 bills introduced.

Information & Training Committee:

Chairman Charles Gemlich reported that the Raymond P. Giehll, IV Scholarship application is online.

Community Involvement Committee:

Chairman Parry Schlimmer reported that we need to support Post blood drives and any in the community.

Try local food drives for the homeless, help raise food supplies.

PDC Doug Heiser made a motion to accept the Internal Affairs Commission report, 2nd PDC Mike Pipher. Mike Pipher asked if the Commissions & Committee were allowed to work outside the DEC meetings. They are allowed to work outside the DEC meeting. Mike said that Convention Committee will need to get the work done on the wreath laying as soon as possible. There are currently no Scholarship applications, deadline is 6/1/2020. David Miller will have the Campout flyer to the Adjutant on Monday. Motion passed.

Rehabilitation Commission:

Acting Chairman James Arter reported all committee reports were completed and turned in. The following reports were given:

Indiana Veterans Home Committee:

Chairman Dewey Long came forward and reported that the October 19th bingo started off with a little confusion, but soon got fixed. We had 51 players who all enjoyed themselves even with the new caller. We had some inventory left over, but we hope to get rid of it in December. We had 27 helpers from the SAL, Auxiliary and the Bloomfield NJROTC. We received a \$50 donation from the 8th District SAL and a \$50 donation from Squadron 200. Both donations will go toward the December bingo.

The Annual Christmas Bingo on December 21st went great. We had approximately 58 players. We had 37 helpers from the American Legion Family from all over the state. We also had 7 members of the Bloomfield NJROTC helping the residents and Santa. I believe everyone had a great time. We played over 100 games. We got rid of a lot of our inventory but still have some left over. We had \$1545.00 in total donations. We gave out \$300 in one dollar bills from Santa. We gave out our normal \$700 in five dollar bills plus \$995 from the donations to the players as prizes.

Hope to see everyone at our next bingo on February 1st, setup at 12:30 pm, bingo starts at 1:30 pm till 3:30 pm.

Homeless Veterans Committee:

Chairman Mike Bottom came forward and reported that they are breaking ground on a new 75 unit Veterans Housing facility in Hobart that will be under the guidance of the VA.

The Veterans Home in Gary has been newly remodeled.

Chairman Bottom said that he will be compiling a list of Homeless Veterans Shelters throughout the state.

Veterans Affairs Volunteer Services Committee:

Chairman Brian Hauser came forward and reported that we need to work closer with our local VA.

Veterans Education & Employment Committee:

Chairman Dennis Budd came forward and reported that COLA, Cost of Living Adjustments, for retired veterans went up in December of 2019 by 1.6%.

Stand Downs and Job Fairs in the area have been successful.

There was a Job Fair in Lafayette last week.

If you hear of any Job Fairs in your area, get the word around.

PDC James Arter made a motion to accept the Rehabilitation Commission report, 2nd 11th District Commander David Miller. Motion passed.

David Stephens introduced Bob Oeth from Elberfeld Post 351.

Bob Oeth came forward and presented a check from the Annual 8th District Auction held at Post 351. Bob gave the \$2411.00 check to Commander Martin for his IVH project. Commander Martin gave Post 351 a Commander's Club plaque.

Finance & Budget Committee:

Chairman Raymond Giehll, Jr. reported the committee had gone over the expenditures from August-December.

The Committee will be working on the 2020-2021 budget before the Spring Conference.

Edinburg Squadron 233 has been donating monthly to the USO. The Committee voted to reimburse Squadron 233 \$225 from the Veterans Assistance budget line item.

PDC Raymond Giehll, Jr made a motion to accept the Finance & Budget Committee report, 2nd PDC David Stephens. Motion passed.

David Stephens introduced Department Membership Chairman Rich Brown.

Department Membership Chairman Rich Brown came forward and addressed the meeting.

Chairman Brown said he is a dual member as an SAL member of Squadron 276 as are both of his sons. Rich thanked the SAL for all they do for the American Legion. Chairman Brown said that the Department will be having a membership Stand Down on 3/21/2020 knocking on the doors of lapsed members. The idea is to check on their wellbeing and ask them to rejoin the

American Legion. Chairman Brown said this will be a Full Court Press and asked the SAL to also assist in all 11th Districts. See your American Legion District Commander.

Resolutions Committee:

Chairman Mike Pipher reported that there were 3 resolutions turned in time for the DEC meeting, but one of them had been withdrawn. Mike read the other 2 resolutions.

Chairman Pipher said both resolution were received and filed.

Sons in Need Committee:

Chairman Parry Schlimmer reported that one member of Squadron 143 requested \$500 and it was approved.

District Commanders need to bring up the program information in their meetings.

We need to keep the money coming in to fund the program.

Southern Vice Commander Parry Schlimmer made a motion to accept the Sons in Need Committee report, 2nd Southern Vice Commander Jeff Coulter. Motion passed.

Membership & Squadron Expansion Committee:

Chairman Greg Wagner reported that possible new squadrons at New Carlisle in the 10th District & Attica in the 6th District.

We had a great card turn in this weekend and Indiana will meet the National Membership goal. 5 squadrons hit 65% in December.

There were over 2700 cards turned in this weekend.

We have launched the transmittal portion of MySAL. Step by step instructions are on the Detachment website.

Chairman Wagner gave out the following membership awards:

11th District Commander David Miller made a motion for the Detachment to recognize 11th District 1st Vice Commander Rick Masters in his absence as representing the 11th District with full rights and privileges of a District Commander, 2nd PDC James Arter. Motion passed.

10th District Commander David Brown said he will be incapacitated for about 6 weeks and 10th District Executive Vice Commander David Mummert would be filling in during that time.
