SAL online membership renewal coming in July

The new Squadron Data Report (SDR) will help Sons of The American Legion squadrons keep their membership rolls up-to-date and will eventually allow members of those squadrons to renew their membership online.

It's part of the new MySAL.org launching April 1; however, SDRs for 2021 will not be due until May 15. Online SAL membership renewal will go into effect in July for the 2022 membership year, provided that a member's squadron has submitted an SDR.

Squadrons that do not submit an SDR will not have member renewal capabilities until the form is submitted and recorded.

The Squadron Data Report is available for download [here](#). Note that the instructions with the download call for an April 15 deadline to submit, but for 2021 that deadline has been extended to May 15.

The Consolidated Squadron Report (CSR) has also been revised to allow for online submission through MySAL.org. The CSR is also available for download [here](#).

National Commander brings 'Buddy Check' Message to Montana

In a scene that resembled an old western, American Legion National Commander Bill Oxford was surrounded by horseback-riding American Legion Family members as he was led into the historic ranching town of Geraldine, Mont., March 21.

While it's not uncommon for American Legion Riders to escort the national commander, the riders of the Geraldine Painter Brothers Post 102 Mounted Color Guard prefer organic horsepower over Harleys. "I have had a lot of escorts on my travels, but this was unique," Oxford told Legionnaires attending the Department of Montana Three Rivers District 8 meeting. "Being led by horseback is an experience unique to Montana. Every post that I visit in The American Legion has its special characteristics. But they all care about serving veterans and their communities."

The message that Oxford delivered in Geraldine was the same as what he said a day earlier to District 9 in Roy, Mont. "We have to get a handle on veterans' suicide," Oxford said. "We need to continue Buddy Checks to help veterans cope with the isolation caused by the pandemic and issues that are related to their military service. The suicide rate is much lower for veterans who get in the VA system and receive help. We need to do everything we can to encourage vulnerable veterans to get the help that they need."

In a news interview broadcast by local affiliates in markets throughout state, Oxford reiterated the need for veterans to seek help in a state where one in five suicides are committed by veterans.

“When we think about veterans, we’re a stubborn group (with an) unwillingness to reach out and ask for help. We just want every veteran to know, hey, we’re still here, we want to help, we can help but you got to let us.”

The national commander’s visit marked the end of an era for longtime Department of Montana Adjutant Gary White, who will be retiring after 19 years on April 1. White, a retired Army commander sergeant major, intentionally sought to include smaller communities as part of Oxford’s itinerary.

“Roy has a population of less than 100 yet Post 96 has 26 members. Think about that!” White said. “The post is led by young veterans and they have achieved 113 percent of their goal. Geraldine has a population of less than 200, and its post has 108 members as of today. There are a lot of miles in Montana and members travel long distances to be active in The American Legion.”

The 147,167 square miles of Big Sky Country is dotted with an American Legion presence in even the most remote areas. Since 1952, American Legion posts throughout the department have placed approximately 1,500 cross-shaped markers on Montana roads and highways to symbolize an estimated 3,300 fatalities. Since

some accidents caused multiple deaths, the markers are not intended to be a tribute to an individual but more of a warning of possible hazards.

“Our highway fatality markers are not memorials, but are instead safety reminders,” said Department of Montana Commander Jeff Nelson. “When I pass one of those markers, I’ll look again in my rearview mirror and maybe pay more attention to the speedometer. Not every fatality has a marker, since some accidents cause multiple deaths.”

Baseball is another program in which Montana’s young people rely heavily on The American Legion. Due to long and harsh winters, high schools do not offer opportunities for students to play America’s national pastime. Though the playing seasons are shorter than what can be found in many southern departments, Montana conducts a robust American Legion Baseball program, which includes eight Canadian-based teams. American Legion Baseball is viewed as “the only game in town,” according to the department.

Additionally, the department hopes to instill patriotism among young people by encouraging the legislature to pass a bill which would require the presence of an American flag in every Montana classroom.

“It’s important for young people to see that flag and remember the sacrifices that have been made on their behalf,” White said. “Americanism is one of the pillars of The American Legion, so this is an issue that we think is very important.”

The Montana American Legion is also trying to convince lawmakers to exempt military pensions from state income tax. “We are one of the few states that still taxes military retirement,” White explained. “We believe that exempting these pensions would create a major incentive for veterans to move to Montana. It would send a message that Montana is veteran-friendly and still increase revenue for the state in other areas.”

While Oxford's travel tempo has not reached its pre-pandemic level, the Montana tour came on the heels of department visits to Iowa, Nebraska, and Virginia. "Every department that I visit has shown great hospitality," Oxford said. "We are not done with coronavirus yet, and I encourage all Legionnaires to get the vaccines, practice social distancing when they can and be safe. Even while doing all of these things, American Legion Family members still find ways to serve their communities and strengthen America."

Ohio Legion Riders provide birthday surprise to young boy recovering from COVID-19

After contracting COVID-19, 11-year-old Ohio resident Owen Caswell developed MIS-C (Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children), a complication of the virus that can cause inflammation in different body parts – including the heart, lungs, kidneys, brain, skin, eyes, or gastrointestinal organs.

His condition has kept Caswell at home since January and would end up keeping him confined at home on March 22 for his birthday. So, Caswell's mother, Kristin Siford, put out a public request for birthday cards to be mailed to her son.

While Caswell ended up receiving more than 3,000 cards, some local American Legion Riders

wanted to do something extra. Jeff Clarke, an American Legion Rider and member of American Legion Post 336 in Painesville, Ohio, is Caswell's neighbor and had learned about the young boy's situation.

"(Clarke) suggested we try and do something through the Riders to (AL Chapter 336 Director) Chuck Wiley," said Lewis Ballard, Chapter 336's secretary and the post's historian. "One thing led to another. They started putting the word out. Chuck made a lot of calls out to other motorcycle groups that he knew."

The result was a March 20 birthday parade consisting of American Legion Riders, other motorcyclists, cars, and modified trucks that ran in front of a surprised Caswell – who didn't know about the procession until it reached his house, where he was able to watch it from his front yard. Chapter 336 also presented Caswell with a wooden U.S. flag signed by members of the American Legion Riders.

Ballard said Caswell was "absolutely thrilled" by the parade, which was another opportunity for Post 336 to remind others of why it exists. "Our new commander of our post (36-year-old Nathan Haley) ... is a younger fella, and he and the past commander have always kind of beat the drum of community involvement," Ballard said. "We need to be out in the community. We need to make ourselves visible to keep the awareness out there. Any event that lets us reach out to the community and to do something for the local community is very strongly supported within 336."

Annual Squadron Data Report – SDR (new form) – due May 1, 2021

This is a new form SAL squadrons will be required to complete and submit each year. The new SDR serves two purposes:

1) It is a catalyst that will enable individual membership online renewals on mysal.org. Provided the member's squadron submits an SDR, those members will be able to renew their membership online starting in the 2022 membership year (July 2021). Upon completing the SDR, adjutants are required to send a copy to their detachment and national headquarters. Once national receives your SDR, your squadron per capita is recorded and will enable those squadron members the ability to renew their membership online. Squadrons that do not submit an SDR will not have member renewal capabilities until their form is submitted and recorded.

2) After the first year, submitting an annual Squadron Data Report (SDR) will keep your per capita up to date and give your members the ability to renew their membership online.

The SDR does have an annual due date of April 15th, but that will not start until 2022. The SDR is new. I understand it will take some time to trickle down to each of your squadrons to complete and return it. **SDRs for 2021 will be due May 15, 2021.** Currently, our operations center is in the final stages of a major software upgrade that will be available after April 1st. Between now and then, forward the attached SDR to all your squadrons and emphasize the importance of completing the SDR and the shortfalls if they do not.

Consolidated Squadron Report – CSR (revised) due 3rd Friday of July. This year it is due July 16, 2021. The CSR was recently revised to make it easier to complete and can be submitted online for free or sent via USPS for the cost of stamps and a slow process. Over the years, CSR reporting has been less than desired. Every squadron, district, and detachment must make every effort to complete their CSR; it justifies our existence. In comparison, posts complete the Consolidated Post Report (CPR), the CSR equivalent. Post CPR reporting year over year is over 70%. The SAL CSR reporting year over year is far below half of that percentage. You will notice the CSR was also converted to an online format versus printing because the return rate of paper CSRs did not justify the cost of printing them. Last year, only 800 paper forms were returned out of 6,400 sent out.

The SDR and CSR are attached for you to distribute to all squadrons and adjutants. These forms can also be found at www.legion.org/publications (under Internal Affairs tab), www.legion.org/sons/publications, and www.legion.org/sons/adjutants. Access and submission via mysal.org will not be available until after April 1, 2021 when the new mysal.org will be live.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me. Thank you in advance for getting this information out to all your squadrons, and let's get these completed and submitted in a timely manner.

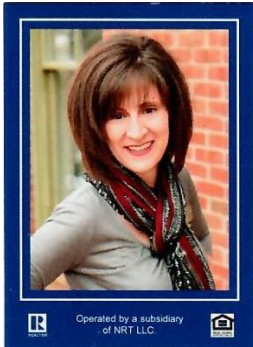
Chairman's Award: A "Best in Show" award. Nominees don't submit specifically for this. The commission considers the award winners and selects one that goes above and beyond the others.

Instructions

Throughout the year, it is necessary for National to contact squadrons regarding membership renewals, awards, and general communications. In addition, National receives daily requests for post and squadron information from members and potential new members or others who are looking for information about The American Legion at the local level. Maintaining your squadron's current information with National Headquarters has become more important than ever.

Completing an annual Squadron Data Report (SDR) is necessary to inform your Detachment & National Headquarters of pertinent information regarding your squadron and, most importantly, membership renewal information. Complete an annual SDR even if your squadron information has not changed. Any information that has changed can be indicated by checking either the "CHANGE OR CORRECTION" boxes.

Squadron information will be maintained with National's records and published on the legion.org and mysal.org websites and through the "Post Locator" feature. Members who are traveling or have moved, or simply want to transfer, frequently refer to the Post Locator for assistance.

Remember to inform your Detachment & National Headquarters any time a change is made throughout the year.

Each question for the SDR requires specific information. Each question requires the following:

- 1) Enter the actual physical location of the squadron's location.
- 2) Enter the mailing address of the squadron (if different than the physical address). This should be the address where the squadron receives all mail and parcels.
- 3) Enter the dues mailing address that is to appear on the membership renewal notices. It may or may not be the same as the regular mailing or physical address of the squadron.
- 4) Write the dues amount each member pays for the current membership year. If your dues are changing, write the effective date of the new rate. Unless noted otherwise, an effective date of July 1st will be entered to coincide with the first renewal notice of the new membership year. Indicate your junior and dual dues rates, include the maximum age the junior rate is valid, i.e., 18, 19, 20, 21 years of age, etc. All district and or county per capita should be included in the annual squadron dues. The squadron will be responsible for paying any local district or county per capita dues directly.
- 5) Enter the business telephone number of the squadron. (Do not use a personal phone number of a member.)
- 6) Enter the fax telephone number of the squadron, if applicable.
- 7) Enter the squadron email address, if applicable. Enter the email address that is regularly monitored.
- 8) Enter the URL of the squadron website, if applicable.
- 9) Enter the name of the squadron Facebook page, if applicable.
- 10) Enter the date and time of your regularly scheduled squadron meeting. (Ex: 2nd Wednesday @ 7:00pm)

The Annual Squadron Data Report must be signed at the bottom of the page by the Squadron Adjutant or Commander. Unsigned reports will be returned for an authorized signature.

The Annual Squadron Data Report must be forwarded to your Detachment & National Headquarters no later than April 15th in order for squadron information to be processed in time for the first renewal notice.

If there is a subsequent change in the squadron's contact information or a change in the dues amount, the squadron must notify their Detachment & National Headquarters immediately. National Headquarters will not be responsible for reporting incorrect information if the proper notification was not received or if notification was not received in advance of the established deadlines.

NOTICE TO DEPARTMENTS & DETACHMENTS: All annual SDRs must be received at National by April 15th in order to be processed prior to printing the first renewal notices. Please forward as quickly as possible to IT/Data Services after receipt from the squadron; this will help ease processing at National.

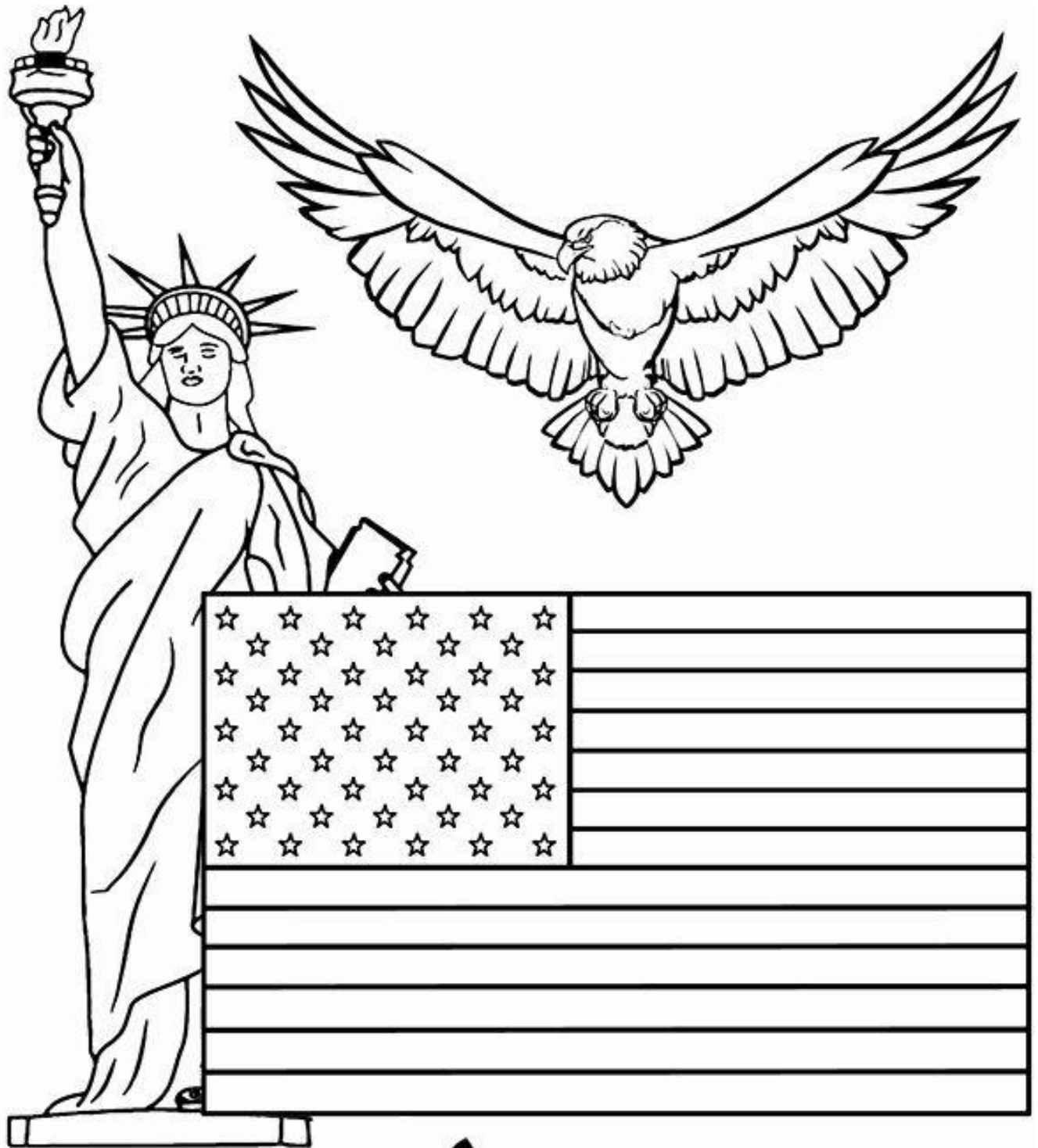
