MyLegion update



All Concerned,

Many of you have experienced the inability to complete online transmittals with mylegion. This is due to the new software and updating the “pro forma” with membership dues for the new membership year. We attempted to make individual online member-

ship renewals active on July 1st and starting the new membership year. This has proven to be a more monumental task and too much work to do all at one time. For the time being, this is what is going to occur. Membership online transmittals will resume by Monday, July 13 or sooner. In the meantime, individual SAL membership renewal capability will have to be suspended until October 1, 2021. I understand this is not desirable; however, it will provide more time for squadrons to submit an SDR. Currently, the SDR response rate is less than 50% overall. In the long run and postponing online renewal will prove to be a prudent decision. As of right now, if an individual were to renew their membership online and their squadron did not submit an SDR, the squadron would have to contact the member again to collect the remaining portion of membership dues (squadron per capita). I think everyone can admit this would be a major point of contention with our members. Everyone is looking for more convenience, not double work. Thank you for your patience as we work through these challenging issues. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.

Are you a new Legion officer? Welcome to MyLegion.org

As elections for the 2021-2022 membership year are underway, newly elected adjutants and commanders at the post, squadron, county, and district level will have access to the administrative side of www.Mylegion.org through their individual account. This access occurs as soon as officers are reported and entered into The American Legion national membership database. Reporting of officers is done through the department using the department’s officer certification form.

If you have a MyLegion.org account, there is nothing more that you will need to do upon your elected officer position. If you have not registered for a MyLegion.org account, please follow the steps on page 4 so you can access the membership tools available to you as an officer.

Please remember that as of April 1, all MyLegion.org accounts are individual accounts with a single sign-on. Each registered user will have one profile. When you have been updated as an adjutant or commander and log into mylegion.org, you will still have access to your personal membership data in MY ACCOUNT, but the MY GROUPS tab will now appear. Post, district, county, detachment, and squadron officers will see additional officer tools under MY GROUPS to manage membership and have full access to electronic rosters.

Even though sharing of credentials is no longer available, administrative officers have authority to assign MY GROUPS permission to others who have their own MyLegion.org account. Information about assigning group permissions is available in Online Help at mylegion.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Resources/Help under the MY GROUPS tab.

My Groups provides the capability to:

- Export and print electronic membership roster.
- Email members.
- View and edit member information.
- Access membership functions such as view members; see members renewed online; do a global member lookup; access reports and labels; process membership; and manage Consolidated Post Reports and Consolidated Squadron Report.

Don't have MyLegion.org account? Register now. Register a www.MyLegion.org account with the email address on your membership record. Do not register with a public email such as post123@yahoo.com. To verify the email on your membership record, contact your department headquarters or American Legion Customer Service at 800-433-3318.

Account registration help is available at mylegion.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Resources/Help to assist with registration, navigating your account and My Groups for American Legion and Sons leadership. Videos are also provided to walk you through how to use the new MyLegion.org platform.

To register a MyLegion.org account:

1. Go to www.mylegion.org and select "Register."
2. Enter your email in the Register window and click "Next." Register with the email address on your membership record.
3. Enter your Last Name, First Name and check consents and click "Next."
4. Create your password in the welcome window.
5. The email entered must be verified. The email is verified one of two ways:
 - a. Enter the one-time password (OTP) sent to your email and click "Finish Registration." This is sent after step 2.
 - b. Do not enter OTP and click "Finish Registration." An email will be sent with a link to confirm and returns to the login page.
6. Click "My Account" from your MyLegion.org home page to view your membership information. Officers registering for post and squadron access will find that information on the My Account window.

7. **ATTEND MYLEGION.ORG VIRTUAL WORKSHOP.** A virtual workshop on the new MyLegion.org platform will be held during the 102nd National Convention in Phoenix on Aug. 30. The number of in-person attendees will be limited; however, anyone can participate virtually. Details to follow.

Your support of CWF is giving children a forever home

I'm proud to say that the American Legion Family has had another strong year of supporting the Child Welfare Foundation (CWF).

The CWF ended the 2020-21 program year with \$435,312 in donations. Of those donations, more than \$317,000 came from the Sons of The American Legion – the single largest contributor to CWF, donating nearly \$9 million since 1988. And together, The American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary donated over \$88,260.

The Child Welfare Foundation, cwf-inc.org, provides grants to nonprofits that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual welfare of children and youth through programs, research, and resources. One hundred percent of all money raised for the foundation is used exclusively for grants.

Your support of CWF is providing children a forever home.

Logan Belle was born in December 2020 to a teenage mother. The birth mother decided to proceed with adoption for Logan, who was matched with a family in Indiana. To financially complete the adoption process, a \$5,000 grant from Gift of Adoption was provided to Melea and Christoph so they could bring Logan home to be a family.

Gift of Adoption of Northbrook, Ill., is a 2021 American Legion Child Welfare Foundation grant recipient of \$25,000 to help provide adoption assistance for children in the United States. This is the second \$25,000 CWF grant provided to Gift of Adoption whose mission since its founding in 1996 is to “provide adoption assistance grants to bring the most vulnerable children into permanent, loving families and really changing the trajectory of their lives,” said Julie Pendell, chief development officer at Gift of Adoption Fund. “I love that it’s a mission of real people’s stories.”

Gift of Adoption supports children who are at risk of entering foster care, aging out of foster care or an orphanage, and who have medical needs. They too focus on keeping siblings together through adoption.

In its 25-year history, Gift of Adoption has provided over \$11 million in grants to unite more than 3,800 children with permanent families. The organization’s goal this fiscal year is to unite 525 children with families in honor of its 25th anniversary. And The American Legion’s CWF grant is helping achieve this.

Five children, including Logan, have been placed in forever homes thanks to the CWF grant with the rest of the funds to be expended on Gift of Adoption assistance grants through the end of 2021. Families that apply for a grant from Gift of Adoption have already been matched with their child(ren) and are in the process of adopting “but coming to the point where they can’t finalize the adoption due to lack of funding,” Pendell said. “They apply to Gift of Adoption for those final funds.”

Pendell said an average Gift of Adoption grant is \$4,000 but can go up to \$15,000. About seven hundred families apply every year for grants, and the organization can help just over half of them due to available funding. The organization has twenty-six chapters across the country that are volunteer driven with a goal of fundraising and awareness.

“A donation to a Gift of Adoption really does change a child’s life forever,” Pendell said. “And generationally too because that child goes on and their life is changed, the generations that follow that person are also changed ... all because of one generous donation or a donor allowed us to give a grant to those parents.

“A grant that is truly transformational for the child and the family. I love that you can so easily take the picture of that change to our donors. Every story is hinged on the fact that people or companies, or organizations or foundations came alongside the mission and made that happen.”

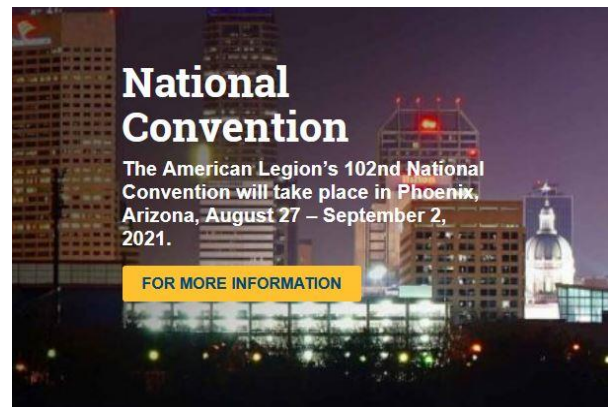

RE: Call to National Convention in Phoenix, AZ

All,

1. **Delegates** - All delegates must be pre-paid; no money will be collected for delegate registration at the convention. Delegate registration forms are due by August 6, 2021.
2. **Waivers** - must be signed by all delegates and guests of your detachment. The detachment adjutant will be responsible for collecting signed forms and have them available upon request with whichever media you choose. The detachment adjutant, upon picking up their credentials, will also be responsible for penalties, if any, imposed by the enforcing authority for failure to obtain a signed waiver or unable to produce said waiver.
3. **Expense Reports** – PNCs, commission & committee chairman & national officers approved are eligible for travel only to be reimbursed. This does include if flying baggage, taxi to and from home to airport and airport to your

hotel with the set rates. If you feel these set rates are not fair, you are more than welcome to submit your expense report after the convention along with your actual receipts. If you want your expense check at the convention, your travel reimbursement is due to HQ by August 6, 2021, or you can submit your report after the convention, and a check will be mailed to you.

At this time, NEC members are not eligible for travel reimbursement to the convention. The resolution addressing this is still pending and cannot be executed until fully vetted and approved by the SAL NEC, The American Legion Finance Commission, and Internal Affairs Commission.

For those driving, a cap of five hundred miles round trip will be reimbursed at .51 cents a mile. Passengers who are carpooling at not eligible for mileage reimbursement.

4. **Air Travel** – For those eligible for travel reimbursement, I recommend booking your travel through The American Legion Convention Office, Joyce Hamilton jhamilton@legion.org. This will save time and no money out of your pocket.

**2021 AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL CONVENTION
PHOENIX, ARIZONA
COVID-19 STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING and AGREEMENT**

The American Legion focuses on creating a safe national convention experience for all who travel to Phoenix, Arizona for the 102nd American Legion National Convention ("Convention"). As part of that effort, the following is agreed and understood:

1. I have not knowingly been exposed, nor tested positive, to COVID-19 within the past 14 days. To my knowledge I have not experienced the onset of any primary COVID-19 symptoms within the past 14 days, including: a fever of 100.4 degrees F or higher, a new persistent cough, a shortness of breath or any new breathing difficulties.
2. For everyone's safety, I will wear a face covering/mask at all times inside any Convention venue unless actively eating or drinking. My face covering/mask will be clean, free from stains, dampness, or being soiled.
3.
