

The American Legion to Congress: 'Pay the Guard'

Virginia Army National Guard Soldiers assigned to the Manassas-based 229th Military Police Company, 529th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 329th Regional Support Group, stand guard Jan. 10, 2021, in Washington, D.C. National Guard Soldiers and Airmen from several states have traveled to the National Capital Region to provide support to federal and district authorities leading up to the 59th Presidential Inauguration.

The head of the nation's largest veterans organization warned Congress that the American people will "be furious," if partisan gridlock causes a shutdown of the National Guard and delayed paychecks for its soldiers.

"Congress and the White House need to act immediately to ensure that our National Guard is fully funded, and its members compensated for all of their drills, missions and deployments. Have they already forgotten the thousands of National Guard members who protected the Capitol during civil unrest just a few months ago? Or the crucial role of our National Guard members in America's response to COVID-19?" American Legion National Commander James W. "Bill" Oxford asked. "The American Legion spoke loudly two years ago when partisan bickering led to an interruption of the Coast Guard being paid. We stepped up and provided more than \$1 million of grants to help hundreds of

Coast Guard families, but Congress still has failed to pass the Pay Our Coast Guard Act. Moreover, it isn't the job of private nonprofit organizations to pay the military. As Americans, we should all demand that Congress never repeats that mistake.

"We are not simply talking about bureaucracies," Oxford continued. "We are talking about families. The men and women of the National Guard have living expenses, bills due and other financial obligations that cannot be put on hold while politicians argue. The volunteers who defend America deserve better."

U.S. flag reminds veteran of those who didn't come home

Since Memorial Day of 2008, a small American flag had been attached to a forklift that Robert First, a veteran, drove for his job. He handed the torn and tattered flag to American Legion Ryan Winslow Post 911 Commander

Ginger Branson during a recent flag retirement ceremony hosted by the post in Hoover, Ala.

"(Robert) told me he has it to remind him of his brothers and sisters who didn't come home. It brought tears to my eyes when he told me the story of this flag," Branson said.

That flag joined the other nearly 200 unserviceable flags for Post 911's flag disposal ceremony held at the post home with about 60 people in attendance. A new mission of Post 911 is to collect and properly dispose of unserviceable flags.

One of the flags belonged to the father of Post 911 member Scott Landreth. "The flag had been on his property in LaGrange, Ga. When he got a new one, I told him that we would be properly disposing of it," Landreth said.

American Legion D.W. Segars Post 1228 from Hueytown, Ala., is creating flag collection boxes from old newspaper kiosks and will provide Post 911 a receptacle that will be secured outside the post home so unserviceable flags can be collected.

"I've been pleasantly surprised by the response of the community. People really respect the flag as much as us veterans," Branson said.



Creationists would counter that a chicken must have been created to produce the egg in the first place.



We will never really know which of these philosophical "camps" got it right until we "meet our maker." However, the same cannot be said in the relationship between

The American Legion and the Sons of The American Legion.

The Squadron Handbook of the Sons of The American Legion has a section named 'Statement of Status.' To quote from the section, "It must be constantly borne in mind that each Squadron exists through sponsorship of the individual Post of The American Legion, and is subject to such rules, regulations and supervision as shall be created by the sponsoring Post, not in conflict with rules and regulations set up by the National Executive Commit-

tee." Every officer of every Squadron needs to familiarize himself with this section in the handbook.

The American Legion Post is the basis for everything the Squadron does or does not do. The Post has a right to see your Squadron records, supervise your activities, and set your rules and regulations. They can determine the amount of your dues, assess a portion of the dues to be paid to the Post, and approve your expenses. The Post should also approve your meeting minutes, where you approve expenditures.

The key to a successful relationship between the Squadron and the Post is communication. You must let the Post know what you are doing and, more importantly, why you are doing something. In most Squadrons, this is not a problem. However, every year I get calls from one or two Post Commanders wanting to know how to handle a situation. Sometimes, they have said that the Squadron doesn't want the Post to audit their records, see their checkbook, or change their dues structure.

When the Post and the Squadron can't work out their differences, guess who loses? Not the Post. The Post is the basis for the Squadron's existence.

Without the Post's sponsorship, the Squadron ceases to exist. In the past, there have been Squadrons who lost the sponsorship of their Post. Those Squadrons no longer exist. Don't let that happen to you. Don't get "too big for your britches." Don't get embroiled in the argument of who came first. It is not how you need to spend your time. Read the preamble on the back of your membership card.

Ken's Corner



I wanted to give a brief update on membership processing. All adjutants should be able to process membership online. A few complaints I am receiving is they do one transmittal and then can't do anymore. What we found was just like the old

system; your first transmittal takes a bit longer. This is because the system and banks need to establish a clear path for online bank transactions. Once your first transaction and transmittal are clear, then you should be able to do back-to-back transactions. The first transaction can take up to 10 business days.

Member online renewals – Due to the low submission rate of SDRs (less than 50%) this feature is postponed until October 1st. This will allow time for detachment adjutants to follow up with their squadrons and have them turn on an SDR. I will be sending out a list to each detachment adjutant a listing of their squadrons and the status of SDR submission.

In October, regardless of SDR submission rate, the online renew feature will be live. This means that all SAL members will be able to renew online regardless if their squadron submitted an SDR or not. Those that did not will not have tier per squadron per capita included in the renewal dues price.

Per Capita - Another complaint I have received is the per capita is taking too long to collect from national. Here there is a misunderstanding. National reconciles with each department around the 10th of the month. A check is sent out for all per capita, department and detachment along with a report.

The delay may be with the department dividing up individuals per capita and sending them out. There is no way around this and we cannot stop the individual member from renewing online if they want to. To avoid this delay, perhaps the squadron has an early bird renewal drive and offers an incentive to renew early and at the post.

Reports – the report engine is still lacking and I do not have a solution at this time. Most adjutants in their groupings should be able to run a limited report(s). It is not perfect and still needs a lot of work. The IT division brought a retired employee back to work through some of these issues. It is a work in progress and patience is a virtue.

I hope this answers some questions. If there are any others, please feel free to contact me.
