**Say what?** The following was published in both *Round-Up* and *The Ohio SALute* in the past, but with a new administrative year on the horizon, I thought it would be good to run it again. Please enjoy.

Over the years, I have heard people say, or have read things that were written that made me wonder where it came from. I'm sure that some of you have had the same questions pop-up in your head, but never got the answer. Maybe someone can help answer these questions?

**What is this "ladies" or "women's" auxiliary everyone keeps talking about?** The American Legion Family has no such affiliate to my knowledge. We need to call the organization by its proper name, The American Legion Auxiliary. It is now even more important since ALA's membership is now open to females and males.

**What's a "sal?"** I thought we were Sons. I think Sal could be short for Salvatore. Is he a member?

**Why do Squadrons hold cards?** I was trained many years ago that when a member pays his dues, you send them to Detachment headquarters. Holding cards could cost Squadrons and Districts in receiving monetary awards, Detachments missing target dates, and a host of other things. Get them sent in when you receive them, or at least weekly!

**What are “table officers?”** In other organizations, our elected officials are simply referred to as Officers. Hmmm.

**What’s with the rhythmic clapping during meetings?** As a sports official at many levels, I am around many crowds. I have spoken at many events in front of large audiences. I have not heard this anywhere else. Does anyone know the origins of this ovation?

**Where’s all the kids?** Every Squadron has members who are under the age of 18. Why don’t we see more of them at the Mid-Winter Conference or Detachment and National Conventions? I know that meetings can be boring for younger people, but how else will they learn about our amazing organization?

**Where’s the event?** Too often I see flyers, email announcements, social media announcements asking folks to attend their functions. Many do not list the address or the town. **I pay my dues in the spring.** Who came up with that? It is unheard-of to wait so long. In other organizations I am a member of, one in particular, we have a 30-day window to get our dues paid. If we decide to pay after the 30-days, there is a hefty late fee. What’s the deal?

**All in favor...** I have heard leaders of meetings say the following: “All in favor signify by saying aye, opposed same sign.” Here’s the question, if voting AYE is in favor of a motion, and we say, “opposed same sign,” is everyone voting in favor of the question? I believe it’s the Ayes and Nos or the Yeas and Nays. Just asking.

Since I mentioned officiating earlier, let’s bring some of what I learned there into the Sons. We are always told, “Speak the language so everyone understands each other.” This is a vital part to the success of a sports official. If players, coaches, and officials all use the same terminology to describe something, everyone ends up on the same page.

When we work for The American Legion Family, we need to do the same. Let’s make a concerted effort to say American Legion Auxiliary, Sons, and to use the words that are part of the organization. If we do, there will be less of a communication breakdown, and more people will be on the same page.



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### ***Sons member and American Legion Rider sets professional baseball umpiring record***

In January 2020, Greg Attaway was looking forward to setting a baseball umpiring record once the summer season rolled around.



A year later, Attaway – an American Legion Rider and 20-plus-year member of the Sons of The American Legion – was still without the record. The coronavirus pandemic cancelled the 2020 Pecos League season and left Attaway short

of his milestone.

But that's changed now. At 69 years and six months, Attaway made baseball history on July 17. Lining up as the second base umpire for the Tucson Saguaros-Roswell Invaders game, Attaway became the oldest person to ever officiate a professional baseball game. He broke the previous record set by Baseball Hall of Famer Hank O'Day, who umpired in 10 World Series before retiring at 68 years and two months.

"We were geared up. The 2020 schedule was already written," said Attaway, a member of SAL Squadron 19 in Yuma and Arizona's District 1 American Legion Riders representative. "The next thing I know, it's all gone. I was like 'oh, man.'" But having to wait a year was worth it. "I never set out (to break the record). Somebody came and found me," he said. "But it's pretty damn cool. I'm going to be proud, regardless. But I believe in the old adage 'records are made to be broken.' If some-

body wants to do it at age 69, then by God I hope they're good at what they do."

Attaway began umpiring at age 9 in the National City (Calif.) Little League and made his way through the umpire ranks officiating at the high school level in California and Arizona, including a state championship game in California and several playoff games in Arizona. He's also stood behind the plate for summer college baseball games and believes he may have umpired some American Legion Baseball games, though that was "a long time ago," Attaway said.

He began umpiring for the Pecos League – an independent baseball league which operates in cities in desert mountain regions throughout California, New Mexico, Southern Arizona, Kansas, West Texas, and Southern Colorado – on June 23, 2016. He typically did 20 games a year before the pandemic hit.

Now Attaway is seeing his workload winding down, something he accepts. "I honestly know that I can continue to (umpire). I know that for a fact," he said. "But at the same time, I know it's time to go. I really didn't stick around to break the record. I had intended to do this entire season, but there was a change in assignments, and they went with a bunch of younger guys. And that's life, and I don't have a problem with that."
