Athletic:

Chairman Walter Moore reported the 2024 Detachment Golf Tournament bids will be due at Mid-Winter Conference. The date for the tournament will be changed to the 2nd or 3rd week in September on a Saturday. Asking to increase hole sponsors to \$75.

Legislative:

Legislative Committee member Mark Franke gave the following report:

The Big Four voted not to participate officially in veterans' day at the State House on January 16. While the Department will not be a sponsor, individual districts and posts are welcome to participate through attendance at the event and manning a table. The committee voted unanimously to endorse this decision and recommend it to the Department DEC.

The Department plans to host a legislative dinner in March that would be a private affair, away from the State House. At that time our legislative priorities will be discussed.

The five legislative priorities for the 2024 General Assembly will be released next week. The list includes bills on suicide prevention, tuition waivers at state colleges, free state park admission, life insurance for National Guardsmen and the perennial gaming bill.

Finance & Budget Committee:

Chairman Raymond Giehll, Jr said there will be a \$2 increase in membership dues for the 2025 card year, it was passed at the Detachment Convention.

A motion was made to add a line item to the next budget for refreshments at the Department Oratorical Finals not to exceed \$500. The motion was passed.

PDC Giehll made a motion to accept the Finance & Budget Committee report, 2nd PDC Pfeiffer. Motion passed.

Resolutions Committee:

Chairman David Hanson read one resolution, Tom Potts for Detachment Commander for 2025-2026. Chairman Hanson said the resolution was in order.

NEC Hanson made motion to accept the resolution as a matter of record, 2^{nd} PDC Schultis. Motion passed by majority.

NEC Hanson made a motion to accept the Resolutions Committee report, 2nd PDC Gemlich. Motion passed by majority.

Sons In Need Committee:

Chairman Greg Wagner said the Committee had received 3 SINS requests.

Brazil Squadron 2 for \$500.

Orland Squadron 423 for \$500.

Bristol Squadron 143 for \$500.

All 3 applications were approved by the Committee.

District Commanders need to remind Squadrons of the SINS program and also ask for donations to the program.

PDC Pfeiffer made a motion to accept the Sons In Need Committee report, 2nd 11th District Commander Throgmorton. Motion passed.

Membership & Squadron Expansion Committee:

Chairman David Miller said there is a possibility of 4 new Squadrons:

2 in the 6th District, 1 in the 5th District, 1 in the 10th District

New members are not a problem. We need to work on retention of members. Keep them involved. Give them a call.

When the Legion pops up a tent to promote membership at an event, ask how you can help and join them.

Find Posts that can use a Squadron.

Squadron 263 in the 6^{th} is a new squadron.

Squadron 196 is the first in the Detachment at 100%.

The 10th District and the 7th District have all Squadrons off zero and will receive \$50 each. The third District that gets all Squadrons off zero will also receive \$50.

We have 932 new members.

The 1st District is in first place with 31,36. Second is the 4 District with 27.66%, Third is the 11 District with 27.30%, followed by 10, 8, 7, 2, 6, 3, 5 & 9.

Nationally Indiana is in 29th place with 22.51%. Indiana is 3rd in the Central Region behind Wisconsin and Illinois.

Chairman Miller gave the following checks for reaching goals.

Chairman Miller called National Vice Commander Robert Bristo forward to draw the Squadron winner for the first quarter.

PDC Martin made a motion to accept the Membership & Squadron Expansion Committee report, 2nd PDC Heiser.

Doug Heiser talked about the Ganassi Mobile Post that is helping to get new American Legion members.

PDC Carlton said that it is possible for Indiana to get the Triple Nickel Award this year. It requires 5 new squadrons, 105% membership, 80% retention. We are already on the way. Motion passed.

Americanism Chairman Andy Byers came forward to read the amended Athletic Committee report:

Athletic Committee:

2024 Detachment Golf Tournament bids will be due at Mid-Winter Conference. The date for the tournament will be changed to the 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} week in September on a Saturday depending on the bid accepted.

The Committee is looking at getting a resolution to have a Detachment Bowling Tournament in the future.

The Committee is looking at raising the hole sponsorships.

PDC Hanson made a motion to accept the amended Athletic Committee report, 2nd PDC Long. Dewey Long asked if this meant there will be no Detachment Golf Tournament in the 2023-2024 administrative year. That is correct.

Mark Tansel asked that the amount in the Detachment Scholarship fund be determined before raising the hole sponsorships, there might not be a need.

Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Immediate Past Detachment Commander Charles Gemlich came forward and presented his remaining awards for donations to his project of Operation Comfort Warrior. PDC Gemlich passed out the plaques for the trophies awarded at the Detachment Convention.

NEW BUSINESS:

Judge Advocate Richard Pfeiffer made a motion to revoke the charters of Squadron 123 in the 8th District & Squadron 413 in the 2nd District for not having 10 members for 2 membership years, 2nd PDC Schultis. Motion passed by majority.

PDC Pfeiffer made a motion to have a letter drafted and sent to Posts 54, 161, 279 & 608 to inform them that their SAL charters would be revoked if they do not have 10 or more members by Close of Books 2024, 2nd PDC Mark Tansel. Motion passed.

PDC David Stephens said the National Oratorical will be in Hillsboro, MI and asked if there were plans to send Indiana members to attend. Oratorical Chairman Mike Pipher said that National moved the contest and there are no plans to send Indiana members.

PDC Mark Tansel introduced Brandon Curry, NEC from Kentucky. Mark invited Brandon to see how the Detachment of Indiana operates its DEC meeting. Brandon recently retired from the USAF as a Master Sergeant.

Adjutant Giehll presented the plaque the Detachment received for our donations last year to the American Legion Legacy Fund.

Tom Potts said he is now 2 ½ years in remission.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Adjutant Giehll read a letter from the Child Welfare Foundation that came with the Gold Award presented by NVC Bristo at the General Session for Indiana's donations last year.

GOOD OF THE SAL:

NEC David Hanson came forward and introduced Robert Bristo, National Vice Commander, from the Detachment of Minnesota.

National Vice Commander Robert Bristo came forward and addressed the meeting bring greetings from the National Organization and National Commander JR Hall. National Commander Hall's slogan is "Representing More Than Me". National Commander Hall asked that we strengthen the 4 Pillars of the American Legion. NVC Bristo said that 400,000 members this year is a very attainable goal. NVC Bristo said "Believe and Succeed." NVC Bristo presented PDC Sluggo with the CWF Gold Award.

Mark Tansel said this is the second year for the Be The One initiative. Mark read an article from the SAL website concerning Be The One.

Joe Schultis said there will be a Northern Caucus in this room after the meeting.

Squadron 97 is having a shotgun raffle; tickets are \$10 each and it will be drawn when all tickets are sold.

Greg Spaulding gave his final NEC report. Greg said that Indiana was represented at all the National Convention Committees. Greg thanked all the Indiana members for attending the National Convention.

Steve Brock said there will be a Southern Caucus in this room after the meeting.

David Miller said that Squadron 495 will be having their Annual Indoor Putt-Putt Tournament on October 21, 2023. Practice at 11:30 with play starting at noon. \$10 per player and includes food. You can sponsor a hole for \$25. Early Birds can enjoy the Post 495 breakfast buffet for only \$9.
